

Kaman ch'uspa (Leader's Ritual Pouch)

late 20th Century

Medium

Yarn, Alpaca and sheep wool with minor amounts of trade yarns

Description

Kaman ch'uspa ritual pouch/bag for a community kamani (elected member of indigenous village who directs the planting and maintenance of crops. Position usually held by a man and his wife). Traditionally the man carries the coca pouch. This pouch was woven with traditional black field and colorful bands. Black represents Pachamama, Mother Earth.
